Hr hpv testing

- An asymptomatic 47 yr old woman with a history of CIN3 is undergoing annual cytologic surveillance.
- You take a liquid based smear which is reported as being normal but her high risk HPV test is reported as positive
- What is your advice to her?

- A 52 year old is under your care with a history of breast cancer.
- She is on tamoxifen and has not had any vaginal bleeding for 3 years.
- She has had some pelvic pain and you have performed an uss.
- The pain has resolved and the scan is normal but the endometrial thickness is reported as 8mm

- A 58 year old presents with post menopausal bleeding how would you investigate her?



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- A 49 year old asymptomatic woman has a routine smear. It is reported as showing atypical glandular cells of uncertain significance.
- What is the differential diagnosis.

- A 25 year old woman comes to you concerned because her mother has recently died of ovarian cancer.
- She is worried she will get it too.
- Describe your approach to this issue.

- A 24 year old woman with a threatened miscarriage at 8 weeks gestation has a scan. This shows a 6 cm complex ovarian cyst.
- What would you advise her?

Uterine content of 42 yr old



- A 65 year old with some change in her bowel habit has a ct colonogram
- The colonogram is normal but she is reported as having a 4 cm right and a 2 cm left ovarian cyst
- What would you do?

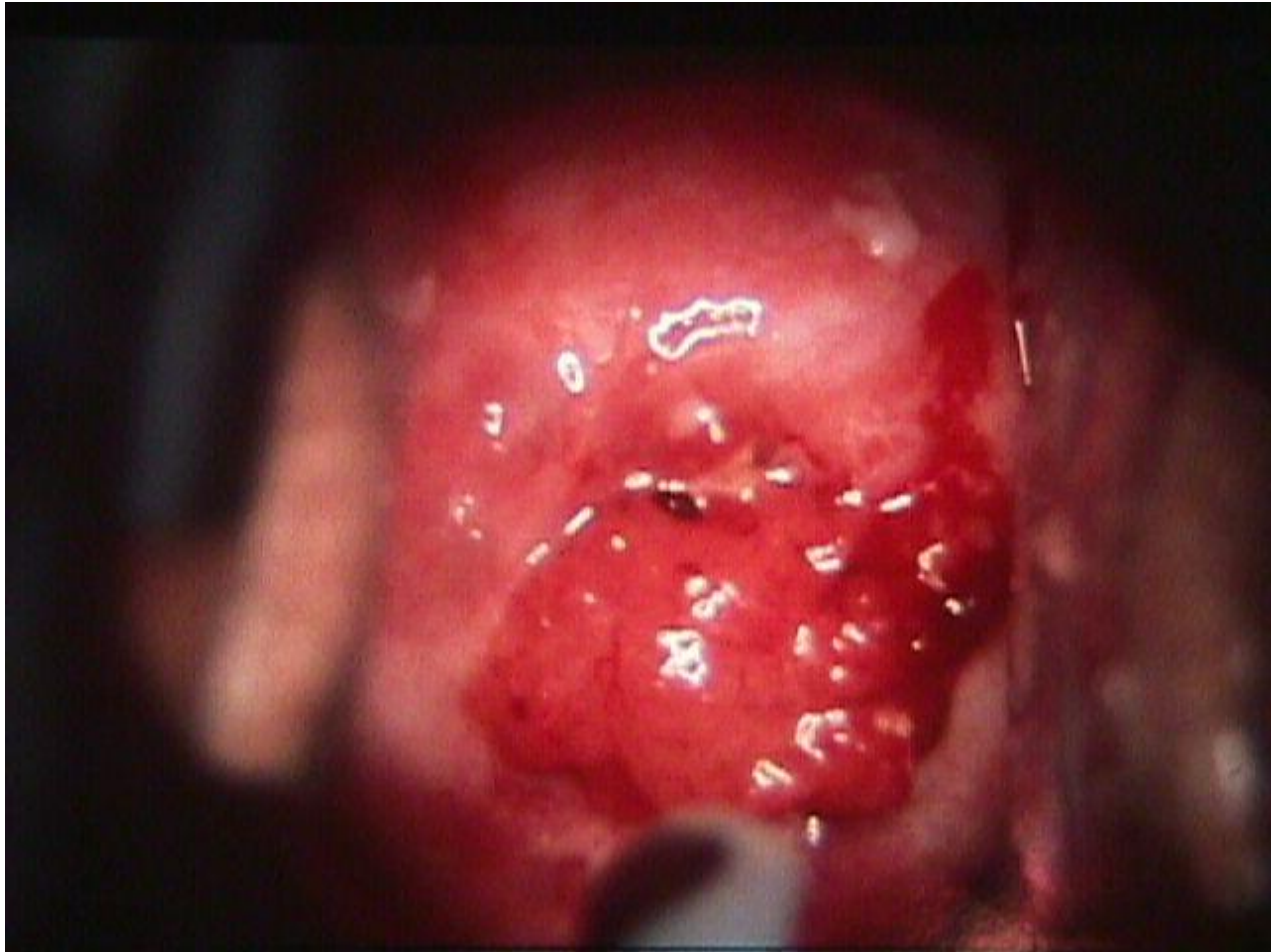


Hpv vaccination

- A mother of a 14 year old girl says she is concerned about the risks of HPV vaccination.
- She also believes her daughter will not be sexually active for some years.
- She requests your advice on the benefit of vaccination for her daughter.



- A 60 year old from auckland moves to your practice
- She underwent a hysterectomy and vault brachytherapy for endometrial cancer 2 years ago and she has been asked to see a local GP for further follow up
- She comes to see you for this
- What would you do?



- A womans smear is reported as showing atypical squamous cells of uncertain significance.
- What should you do?

- An 18 yr old with an unplanned pregnancy visits your practice
- As part of the work up your locum performs a smear
- This is reported as showing abnormal cells suggestive of a high grade squamous lesion
- Your thoughts on this?



Ovarian metastasis

- A 35 yr old woman presents with abdominal pain and lower abdominal distension
- On questioning she has experienced some loose mucousy stools intermittently
- On investigation she has bilateral complex ovarian masses.
- What further investigations would you consider

Rising ca 125 post ca ovary

- A 62 year old woman underwent surgery and chemotherapy for ovarian cancer 12 months ago
- She is asymptomatic but has had a CA125 taken and this is elevated
- She is distressed and comes to talk to you
- What are the important issues that need to be discussed?

Management of small bowel obstruction

- A 52 year old woman comes to see you 3 years from her treatment of ovarian cancer
- She has symptoms of subacute bowel obstruction
- How should she be managed
