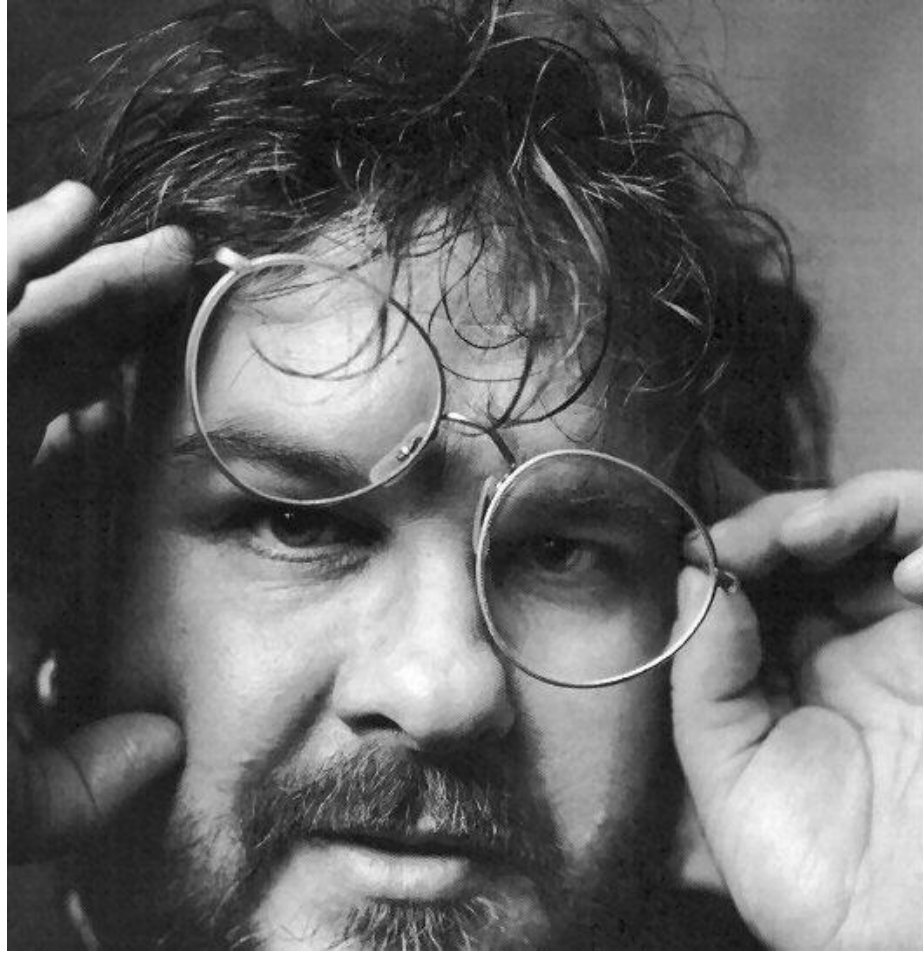

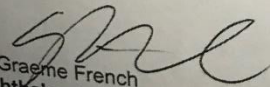

He has been put on the waiting list for left cataract surgery.

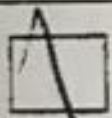

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graph TD; A[Your GP or primary care practitioner assesses your condition] --> B[You are referred to a specialist who determines whether you need specialist assessment]; A --> C[A specialist referral is not required]; B --> D[A specialist assesses your condition and decides what treatment is appropriate]; B --> E[A specialist assessment is not available]; D --> F[Specialist treatment is needed and your priority for treatment is assessed]; E --> G[You do not need specialist treatment]; F --> H[Your priority score is such that you are offered public treatment]; G --> I[Your GP or primary care practitioner continues to care for you]; H --> J[You will receive publicly funded treatment within four months]; I --> K[Your priority score is close to the threshold so you are re-assessed in six months]; J --> L[Following treatment you will be returned to the care of your GP or primary care practitioner]; K --> M[Public treatment is not available to people with your priority score]; M --> N[If your condition worsens you should visit your GP or primary care practitioner for reassessment. You may be referred for specialist advice.];
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The flowchart describes the process for elective services. It starts with a GP or primary care practitioner assessing the condition. If a specialist referral is not required, the GP continues to care for the patient. If a referral is required, a specialist assesses the condition. If a specialist assessment is not available, the GP continues to care for the patient. If a specialist assessment is available, the specialist decides on treatment. If specialist treatment is needed, the patient's priority for treatment is assessed. If the priority score is such that public treatment is offered, the patient will receive publicly funded treatment within four months. Following treatment, the patient is returned to the care of their GP or primary care practitioner. If the priority score is close to the threshold, the patient is re-assessed in six months. If public treatment is not available to people with their priority score, the patient should visit their GP or primary care practitioner for reassessment if their condition worsens. They may be referred for specialist advice.

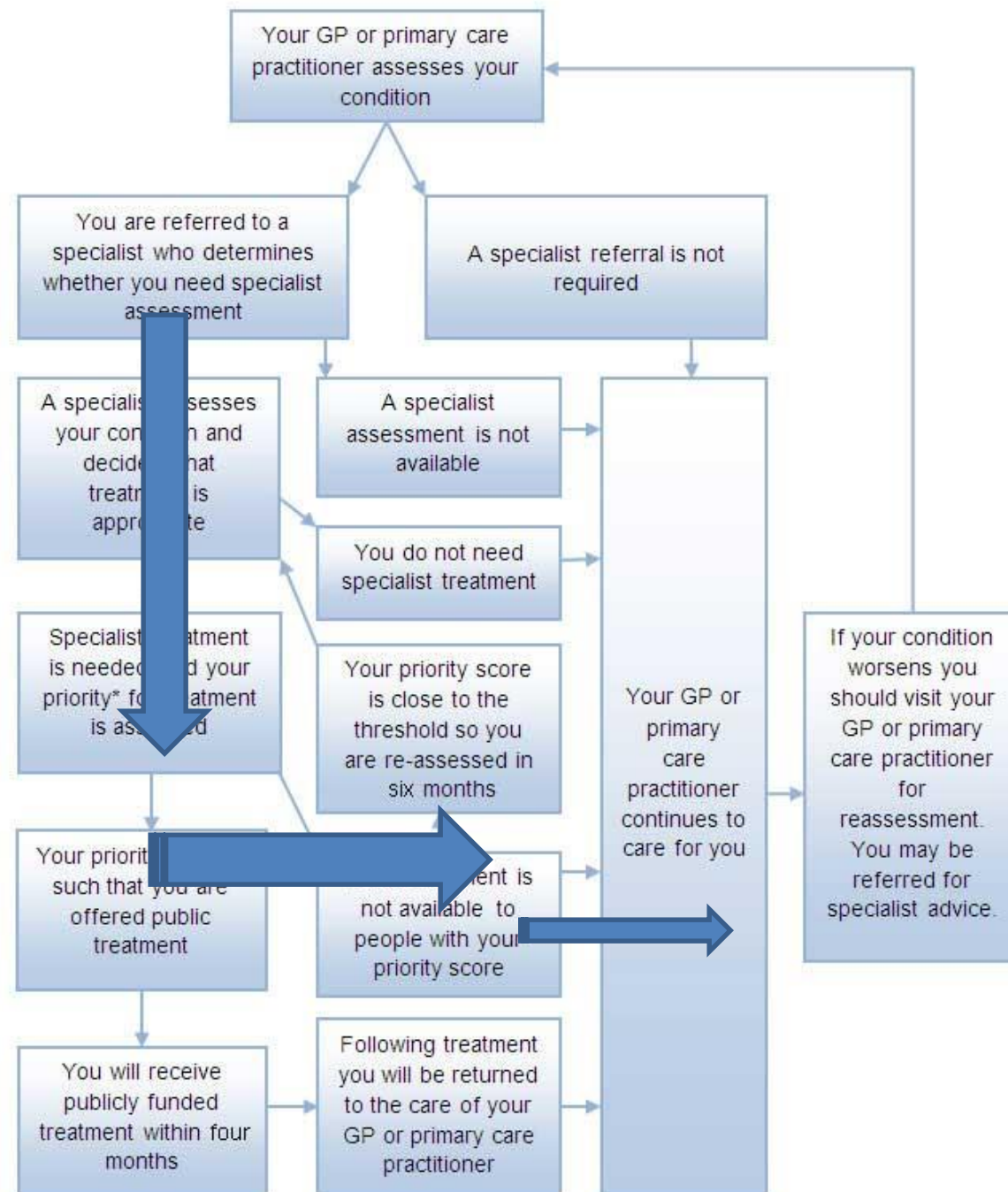
