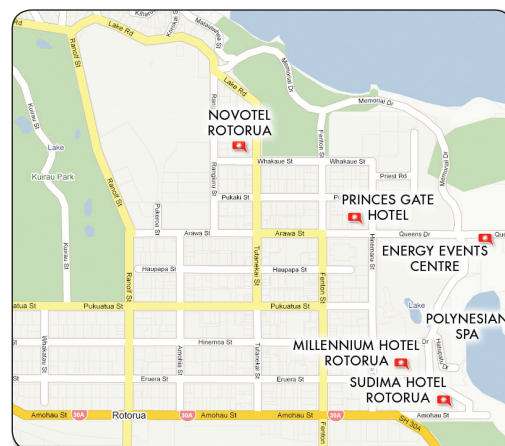

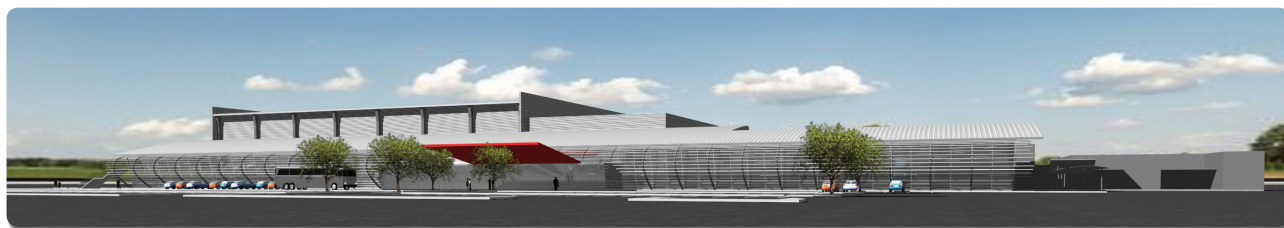

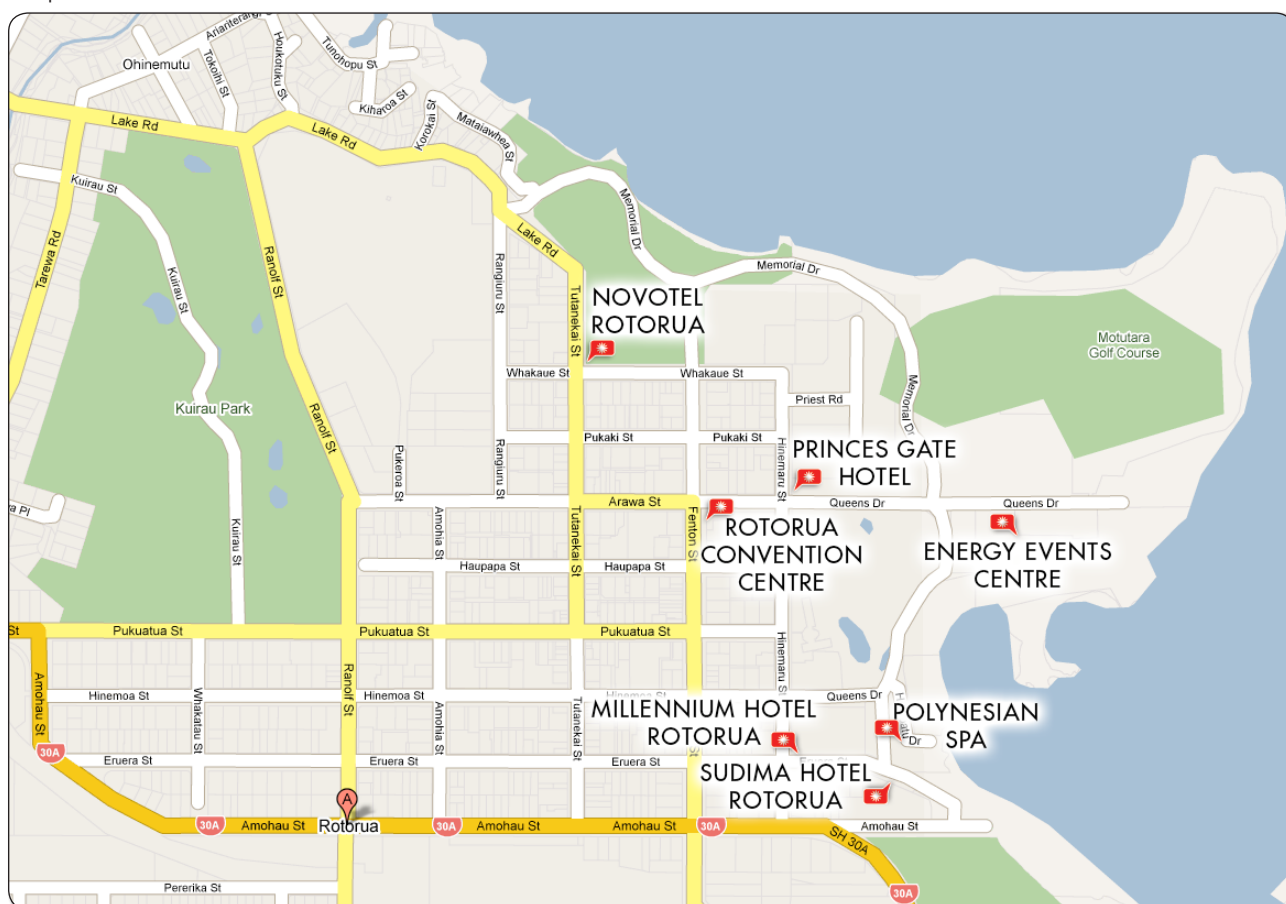
Skyline Gondola over Rotorua
