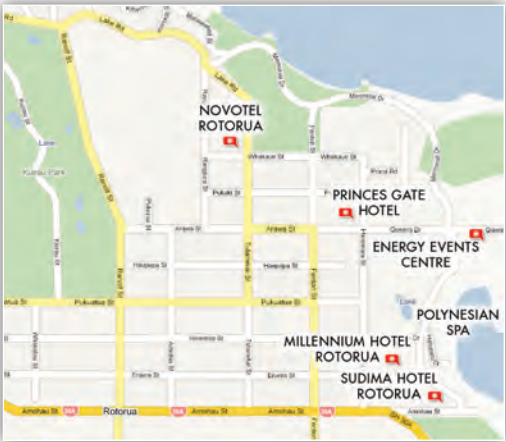

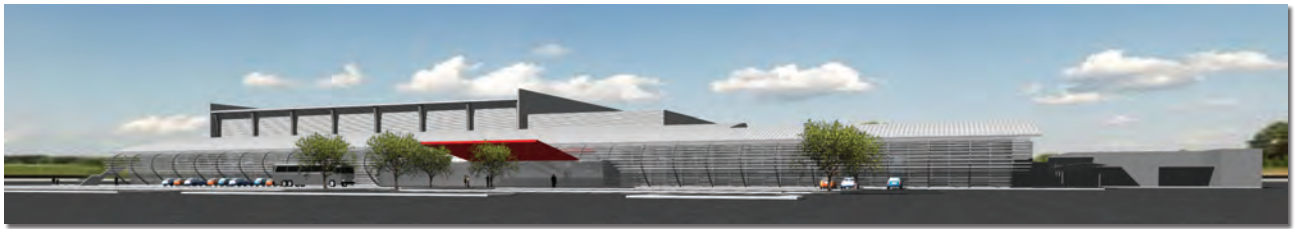

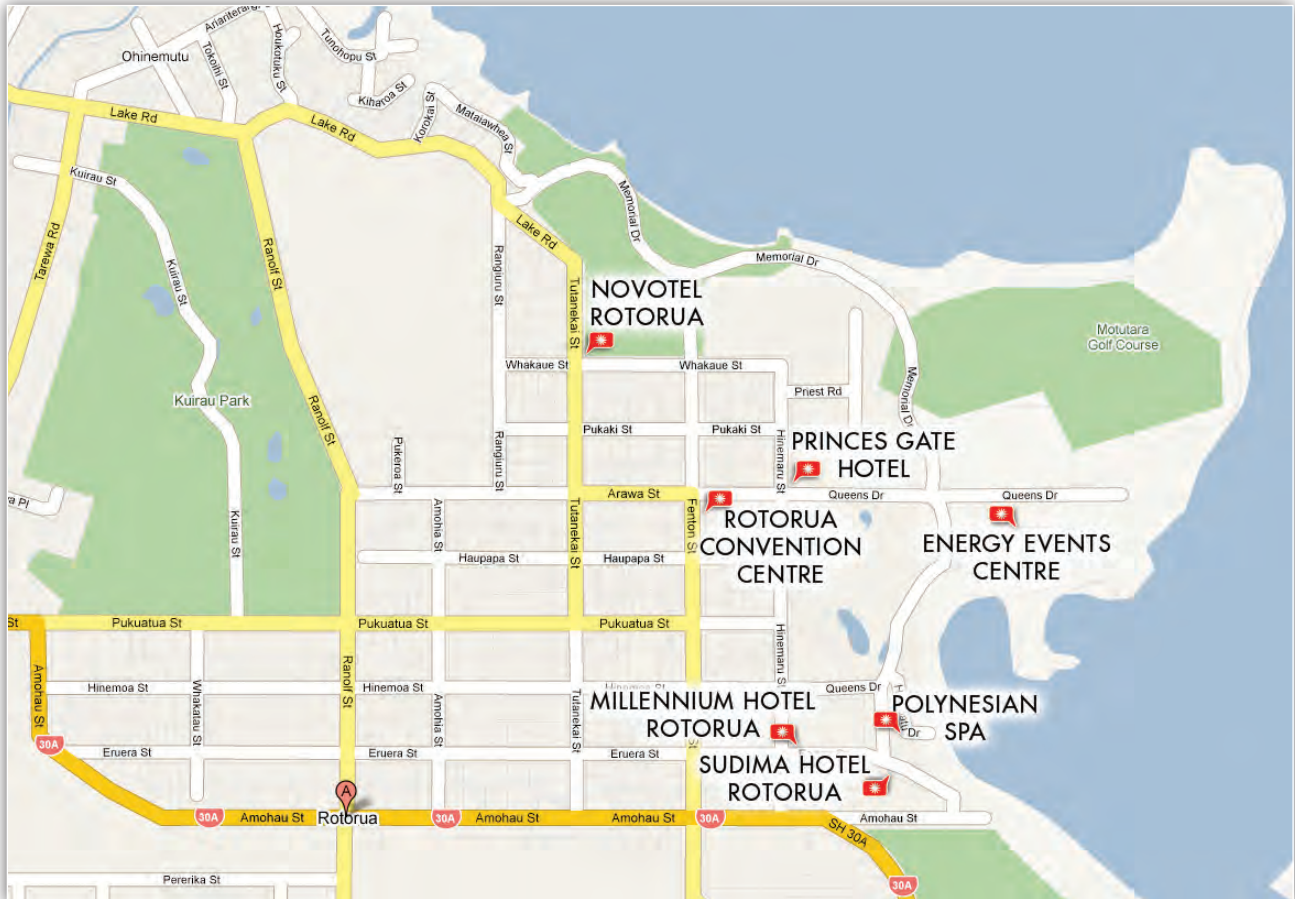


Skyline Gondola over Rotorua
