WELCOME AND KIA ORA TO THE GPCME
CONFERENCE AT ROTORUA 2024

We are delighted to return to Rotorua again in person for this meeting. A very varied medial update programme awaits you. It was also refreshing to be able to mingle very normally in person last year and relationships were rekindled. The social interaction was an injection of joy after the Covid isolation years.

We welcome South Link Education Trust as a diamond sponsor this year as a major supporter at both venues again in 2024 - large player amongst general practice and integral in issues of quality and education in NZ, chaired by Professor Murray Tilyard for some years and a regular attendee at GPCME meetings.

The programme will commence with a karakia from local iwi, to provide their blessing and as a welcome. This year's Peter Foley Memorial Oration will be given by Associate Professor Jim Reid from Otago, with a wealth of GP and university teaching experience, and a special interest in respiratory disease. There will be sessions focussing on post Covid times, osteoarthritis, urology, cancer care, infectious diseases, the microbiome, neurology, genomics and more. The medicopolitical session has been included again on Friday morning in a different format - with a focus on the NZ Medical Council as regulators, and a Q and A session with the Minister of health, Hon. Shane Reti.

A number of sponsored breakfasts will present Managing Heart Failure and CKD (Boehringer Ingelheim), all about COPD (GSK), demystifying Mental Injuries and Sensitive Claims (ACC), GLP_1 medications (Novo Nordisk), and Asthma from whoa to go (Astra Zeneca).

Longer workshops on dermoscopy and skin cancer surgical skills, diabetes in depth, a day of musculoskeletal training, FACT workshops, Polyvagal Theory and mBraining, training in Health Coaching Skills and Lifestyle Medicine, and Managing Medicinal Cannabis in your practice.

On Friday there is a dedicated programme for practice managers as there is on Saturday for practice nurses. They may attend any session of their choice of course though.

The concurrent sessions provide a lot of choice, but do not despair missing out - post conference you can view many sessions online via a password sent to delegates for some months. There are 2 hr forums on skin cancer, care of the aged, Pacific Island Health Issues, Weight Loss 101, Breast Cancer Care, Wellness Management, Ophthalmology, Managing type 2 Diabetes and GP MRI referral training. The large pot pourri of workshop topics should provide something for everyone.

CORE resuscitation courses are on offer as usual throughout the meeting.

Hopefully you can glean support from colleagues and presenters at this meeting, whilst gaining solid medical update. The social networking is always solid. Utilise the conference Whova app which is popular.

Make sure that you enjoy this meeting, catching up on colleagues from throughout the country, exchanging ideas over lunch or coffee, learning business and financial skills, and picking up practice pearls to modify how you manage your patients from next week. 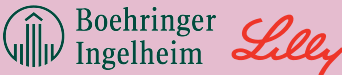
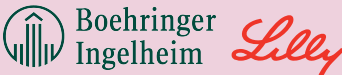

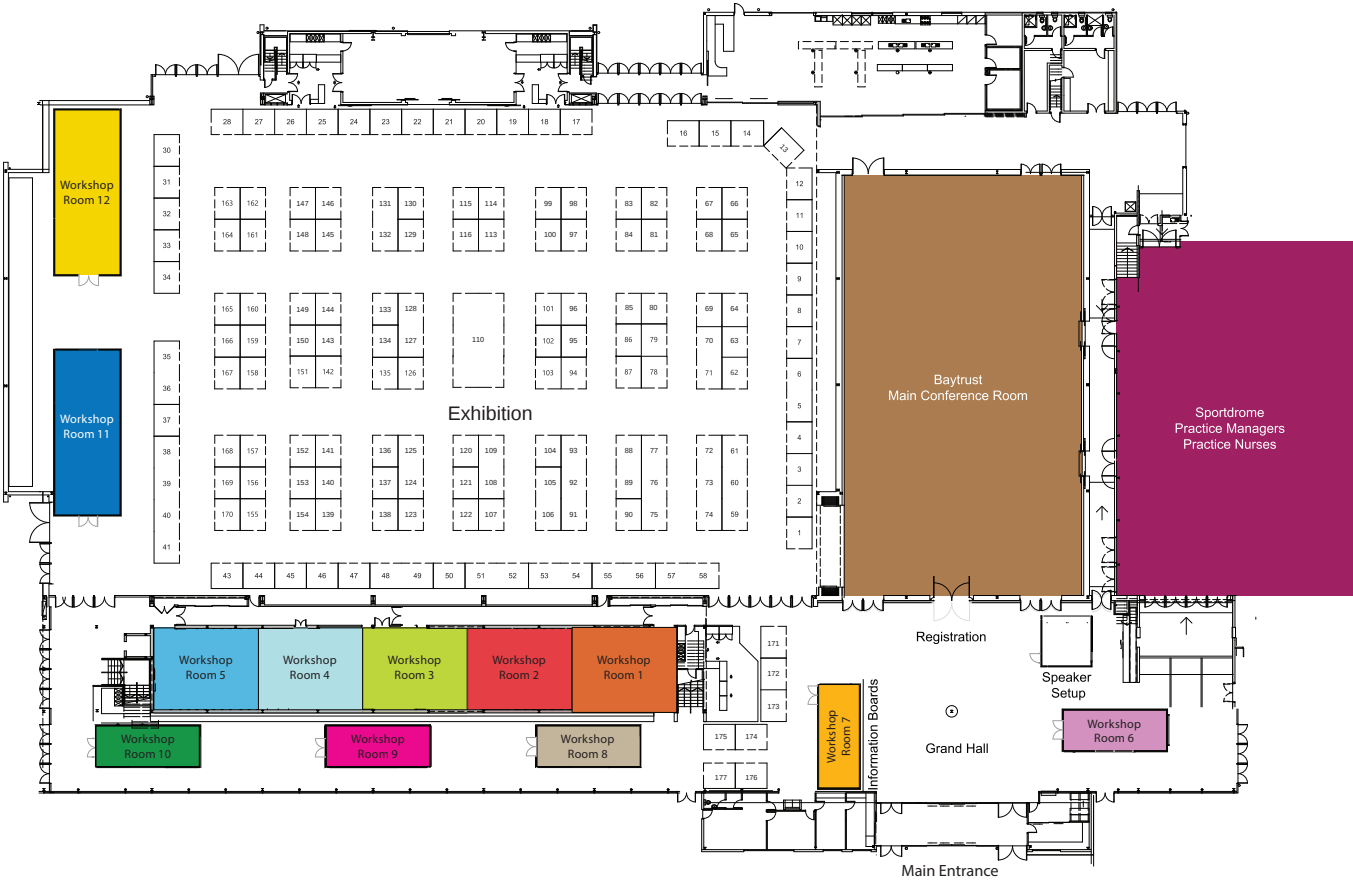
