WELCOME AND KIA ORA TO THE GPCME  
CONFERENCE AT ROTORUA 2025

We are delighted to welcome you back to the Rotorua GPCME Meeting in June 2025. The South Link Education Trust is a diamond sponsor at both venues again this year being a major supporter in general practice and integral to issues of quality and education in NZ. The programme will commence with a karakia from local iwi, to provide their blessing and as a welcome. This year's Peter Foley Memorial Oration will be delivered by Dr Mark Peterson, prominent for his work in medical governance – "The History of GP Representation". There will be sessions focussing on CKD and heart failure, hepatitis management, gastroenterology, immunology, ophthalmology, obesity, cardiology, financial management and more.

The medicopolitical session has been included again on Friday morning with a focus on looking at the issues around a possible "3rd Medical School in New Zealand – Yeah-Nah? "A number of sponsored breakfasts will present All Things Gynaecological (Ascot Women's Health), Linking COPD to CVS Risk (GSK), the Obesity Dialogue (NovoNordisk), Workplace Issues (ACC), and Respiratory Care (AstraZeneca).

Longer workshops on dermoscopy and skin cancer surgical skills, a focus on CKD and heart failure, the lightning process, a day of musculoskeletal training, self-support for clinicians' mental health, clinician wellbeing, and suggestions to cure chronic disease.

On Friday there is a dedicated programme for practice managers as there is on Saturday for practice nurses. Managers and Nurses may attend any session of choice of course though.

The concurrent sessions provide a lot of choice, but do not despair missing out - post conference you can view many sessions online via a password sent to delegates for some months.

There are 2 hr forums on managing menopause, breast cancer screening, allergy 101, COPD and asthma, combating obesity, travel medicine, and dermatology. The large pot pourri of workshop topics should provide something for everyone.

CORE resuscitation courses are on offer as usual throughout the meeting.

Hopefully you can glean support from colleagues and presenters at this meeting, whilst gaining solid medical update. The social networking is always solid. Many find utilising the popular conference Whova app helps getting to the right sessions on time and connect on social media.

Make sure that you enjoy this meeting, catching up on colleagues from throughout the country, exchanging ideas over lunch or coffee, learning business and financial skills, and picking up practice pearls to modify how you manage your patients from next week. Hopefully you can indulge in some of the many local leisure and adventure activities too.

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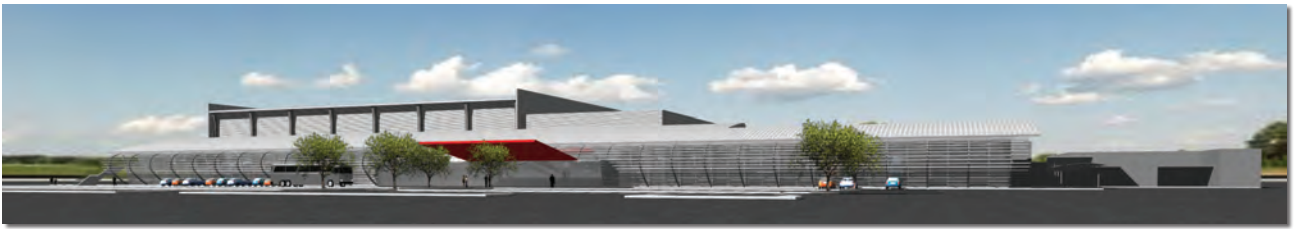

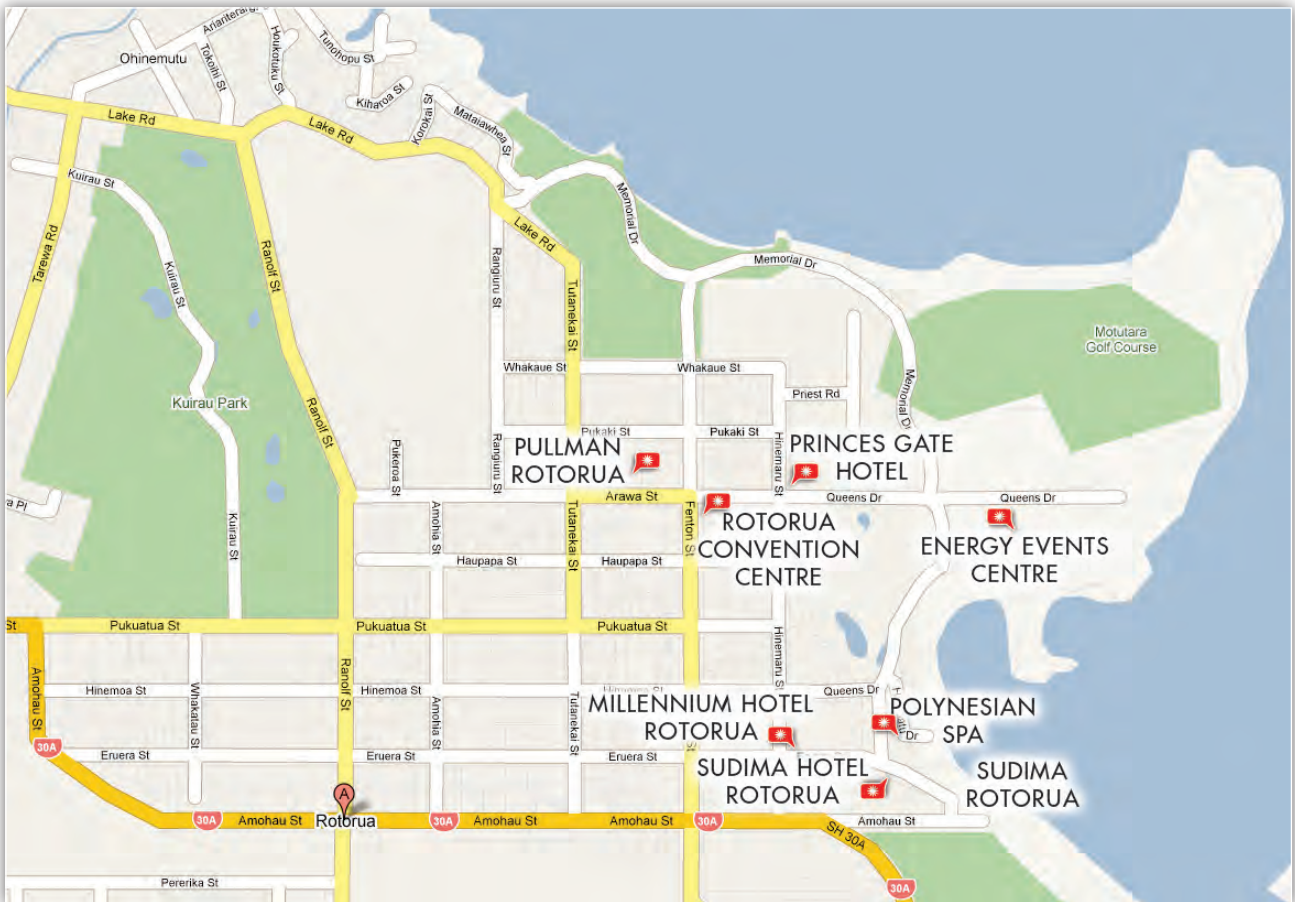
