INVITATION TO ATTEND SOUTH GPCME 2024

We are excited to announce our return to Te Pae in Christchurch, a fantastic new conference facility, for this year's gathering. An engaging and diverse medical update program awaits you, building upon the success of our in-person interactions last year where relationships were rekindled and social interactions brought much-needed joy after the Covid isolation years.

We are pleased to welcome South Link Education Trust as the major sponsor and supporter for the 2024 event. Established in 2003, the South Link Education Trust is a charitable organization dedicated to supporting New Zealand General Practice. Through its associated organizations such as the Best Practice Advocacy Centre (BPAC), South Link Health Services (SLHS), and the New Zealand Medicines Formulary (NZF and NZFc), the Trust remains steadfast in its commitment to advancing New Zealand General Practice.

This year, we will address the pressing issue of the GP workforce crisis, as primary care continues to face significant challenges. Sessions will focus on depression and anxiety, Covid-19 management, questions for the Minister of Health, psychiatry, as well as plenary sessions covering sports medicine, oncology, osteoarthritis, womens health, respiratory and infectious diseases, vaccines, lifestyle medicine and ophthalmology.

Sponsored breakfast sessions will delve into important topics such as managing heart failure and chronic kidney disease, demystifying mental injury, COPD updates, and addressing asthma management. There is also a symposium on Friday night looking at weight loss. Longer workshops on Thursday will cover dermoscopy and skin cancer surgical skills, in-depth diabetes management, musculoskeletal training, practical gynae proceduress, prescribing medicinal cannabis, lifestyle medicine and coaching skills, and NLP, among others.

Friday will feature a dedicated program for practice managers, with a similar program for practice nurses and nurse practitioners on Saturday. Attendees will have the flexibility to choose sessions according to their interests, with post-conference access to many sessions online.

Two-hour forums will cover a range of topics including genomics, GP MRI training, pacific health issues, cardiology, wellness management, haematology, and diabetes management, supported by expert speakers. CORE courses will also be available throughout the meeting.

We encourage you to enjoy the meeting, reconnect with colleagues, exchange ideas, learn new skills, and gain insights to enhance patient care. Additionally, we invite you to explore the local leisure and adventure activities during your stay.

The GPCME Meetings in Rotorua and Christchurch remain dedicated to addressing practical patient management issues and fostering valuable social exchanges. We are thrilled to welcome you all back in 2024.

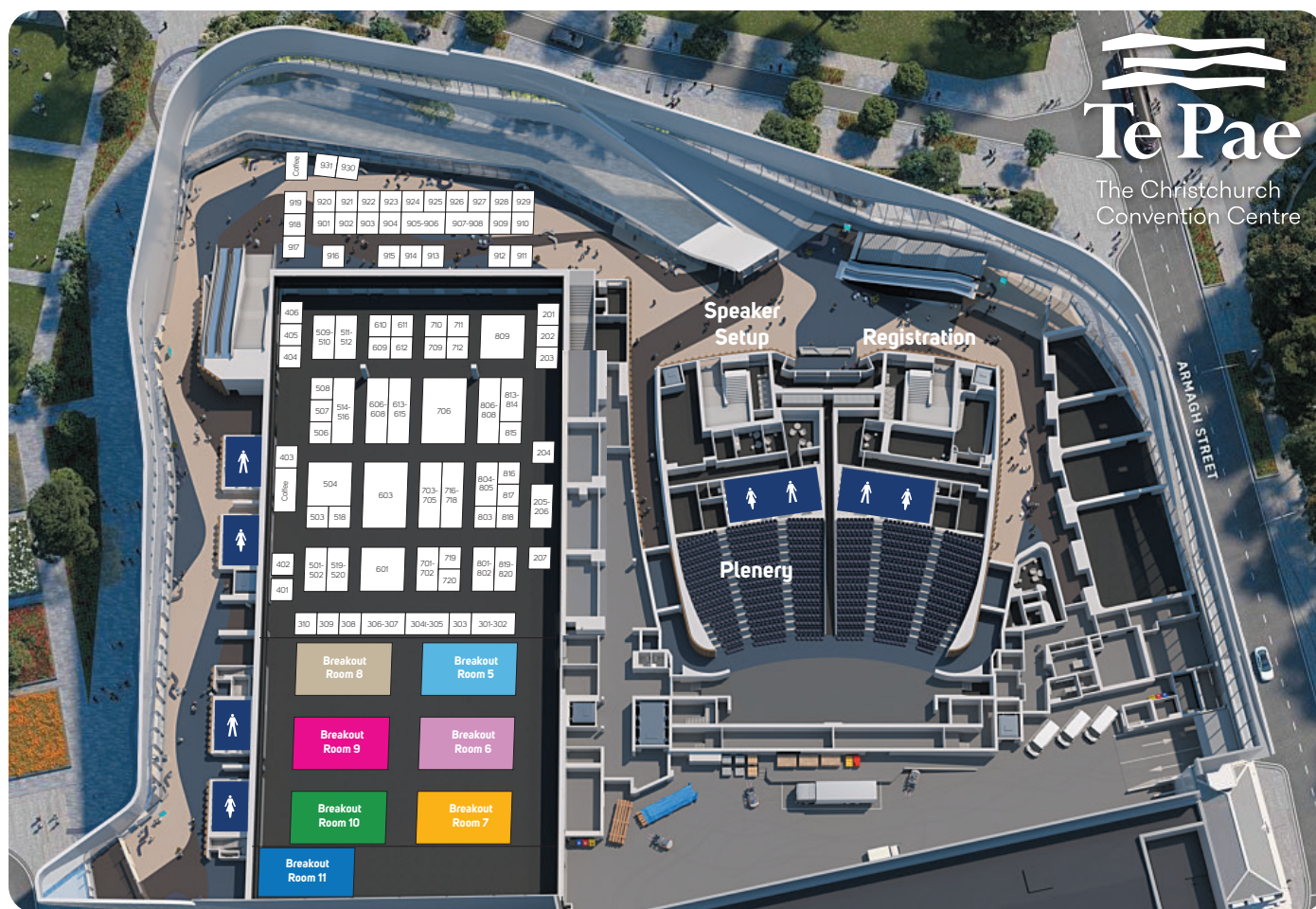

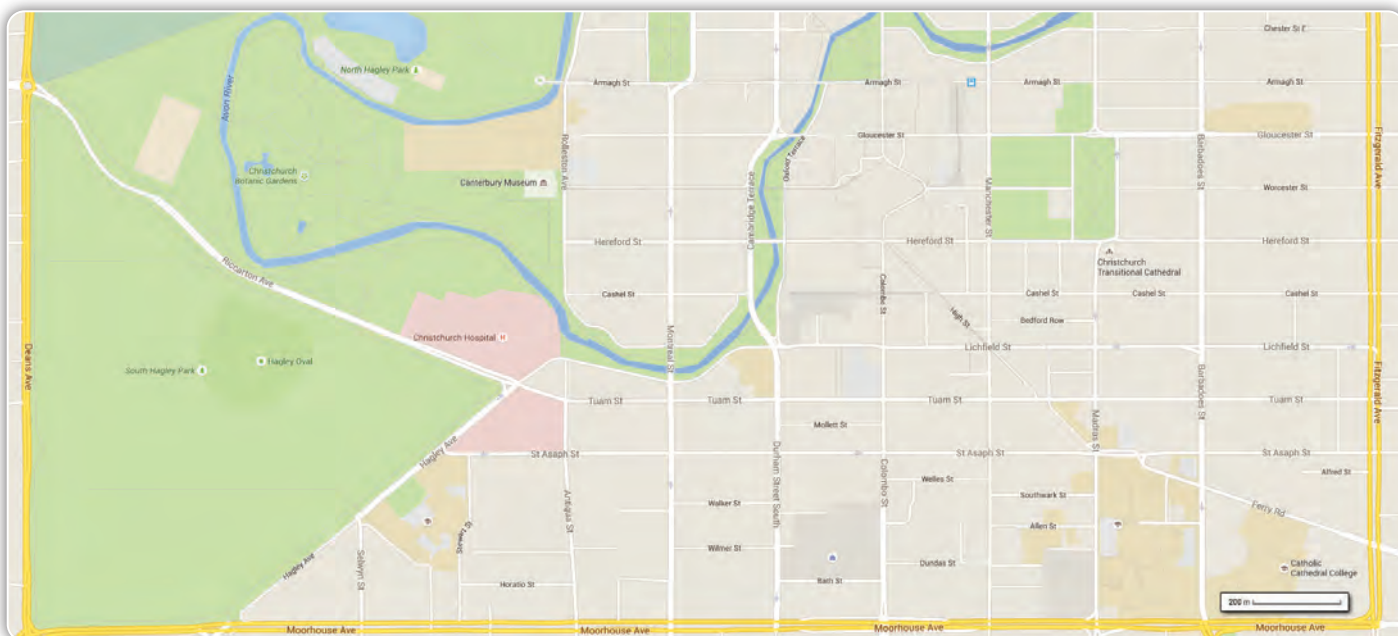
