CONFERENCE AT ROTORUA 2026

We are delighted to welcome you back to the Rotorua GPCME Meeting in June 2026. The South Link Education Trust is a diamond sponsor at both venues again this year being a major supporter in general practice and integral to issues of quality and education in NZ. The programme will commence with a karakia from local iwi, to provide their blessing and as a welcome. This year's Peter Foley Memorial Oration will be delivered by experienced Warkworth GP and ex Chair of the NZMA, Dr Kate Baddock, presenting "This GP's Perspective on Life, Work and Politics." There will be plenary sessions focussing on gastroenterology, a surgical potpourri, a focus on vaccination, neurology, mental health, and the skin cancer crisis.

The Medicopolitical session on Friday morning will be a deep dive on care for the elderly, with a broad range of speakers.

A number of sponsored breakfasts will present All Things Gynaecological (Ascot Women's Health), Healthy Aging through Vaccination (GSK), Food Noise Unravelling – Insightful Perspectives (Novo Nordisk), Skincare in the Management of Acne Vulgaris (L'Oreal), and At the Heart of COPD – Exploring Cardiopulmonary Risk (AstraZeneca).

Longer workshops on Thursday are on Dermoscopy, Skin Cancer Surgical Skills, a focus on Diabetes/ CKD and also on Heart Failure, the Lightning Process, a day of Musculoskeletal training, Havening Techniques for Trauma, Mental Illness and Chronic Pain, a Dermatology Bonanza, Women's Health, Medicinal Cannabis, and a full day of medical update for Nurse Practitioners as well.

On Friday there is a dedicated programme for practice managers as there is on Saturday for practice nurses. Managers and Nurses may attend any session of choice of course.

The concurrent sessions provide a lot of choice, but do not despair missing out - post conference you can view many sessions online via a password sent to delegates for several months.

There are 2-hour multi-speaker forums on Menses to the Menopause, The Uppers and Downers of Addiction, Managing ADHD, Dementia, Men's Health, Ophthalmology, keeping up with AI, and Evidence-Based Nutrition. The large potpourri of workshop topics should provide something for everyone.

CORE ALS resuscitation courses are on offer on Thursday and Friday (8 hours, including exam).

Hopefully you can glean support from colleagues and presenters at this meeting, whilst gaining solid medical update. The social networking is always solid. Many find utilising the popular conference Whova app helps getting to the right sessions on time and connect on social media.

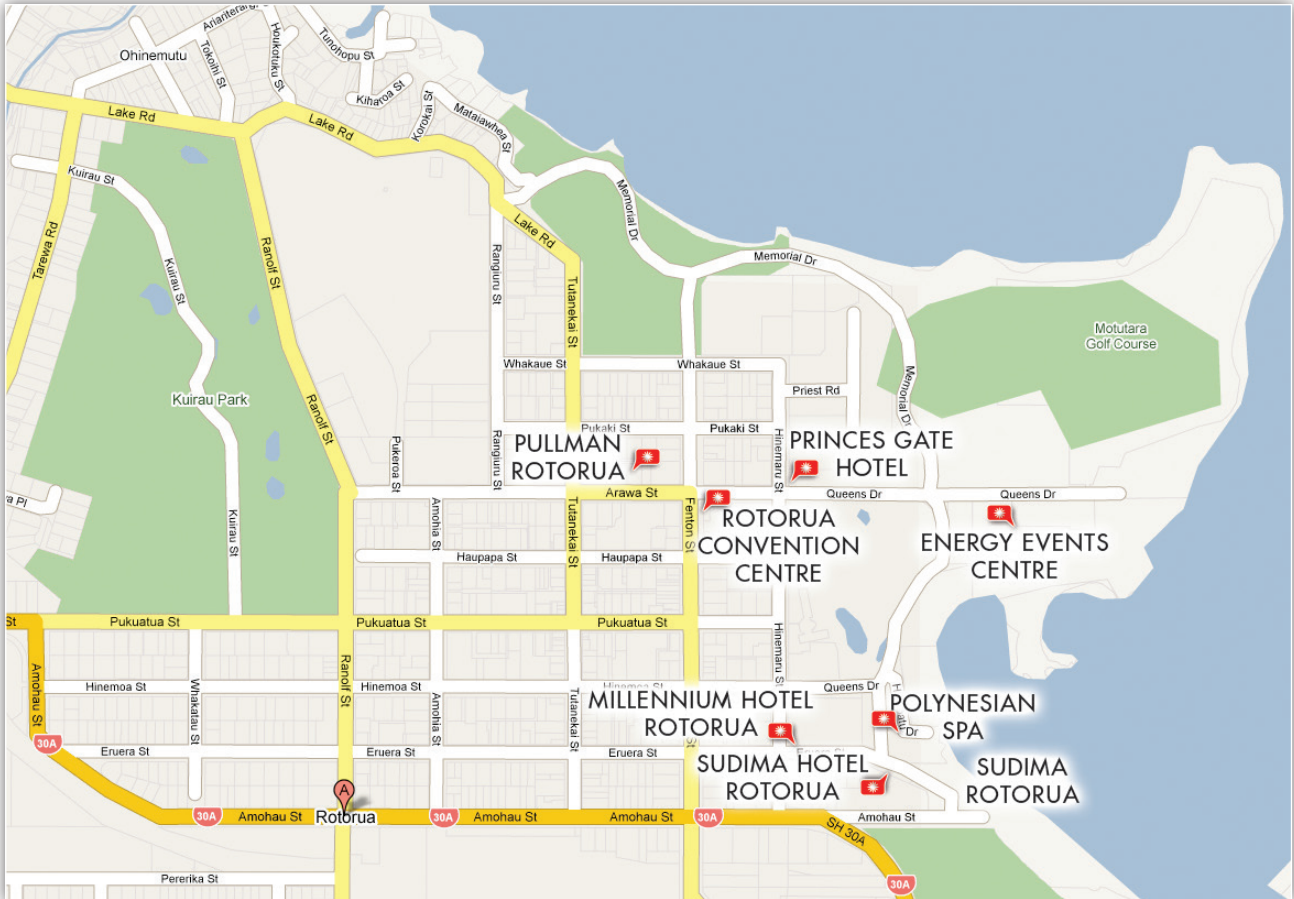
